The [African American Alliance Fund](#) has awarded a first round of grants to 100 Black Men of Orange County, Community Action Partnership of OC and The G.R.E.E.N. Foundation. The fund was launched at the Orange County Community Foundation in celebration of Juneteenth this year to raise awareness about systemic racism and support programs that advance African Americans within Orange County and surrounding communities.

“I am humbled by the outpouring of support from the community and thrilled to partner with the selected nonprofits to advance their mission-critical work for African Americans in Orange County and beyond,” said Tammy Tumbling, founder of the African American Alliance Fund and OCCF executive vice president and COO, in a statement.

Tumbling launched the fund with \$25,000 of her own resources. It has since grown sixfold with contributions reaching \$150,000.

The money is designed to help improve outcomes in the areas of education, health, human services, economic development and civic engagement.
